Missoula County Commissioners honor Jerry Marks with building naming of future Exploration Center

On December 8, the Missoula County Commissioners recognized Jerry Marks' lifelong dedication to agricultural education and community building by naming the future home of the Missoula County Weed District and Extension and its partners in his honor. The Gerald W. Marks Exploration Center and Rocky Mountain Gardens, currently under construction at the Missoula County Fairgrounds, will be the premier



center for scientific education and community-centered learning in the Rocky Mountain West.



Marks, who began his career as a Missoula County Extension Agent in 1969, has been instrumental in creating the vision for the Exploration Center. The project is the culmination of years of planning and dedication by Marks and the many others he brought onto the project. Marks envisioned a center for hands-on community learning in Missoula after visiting an education garden in Wyoming in the early 1990s. He worked with his team at the Weed District and Extension, Missoula County Commissioners, the Missoula County Fairgrounds, Missoula Butterfly House and Insectarium, Healthy Acres Healthy Communities Foundation and Missoula Conservation District to create something bigger and bolder than he first witnessed. At the groundbreaking on May 14, 2021, for the 29,000-square-foot center and 2.5-acre education gardens, Marks celebrated his 80th birthday with hundreds of friends and supporters.

Generous community members help build a place to GROW

On a sunny October evening more than 130 Missoula community members, from rural and urban backgrounds, came together to support the Exploration Center and Rocky Mountain Gardens. The evening raised important funds for the development of the Rocky Mountain Gardens, 2.5 acres of education gardens that will be part of Exploration Center campus, and also celebrated the naming of the Exploration Center boardroom for 4-H and the agricultural community. The highlight of the

evening was the bidding on a 1955 red Willys Overland Pickup donated by Jim and Bonnie Mountain. We began the evening with a \$50,000 goal and ended with over **\$100,000** in gifts and commitments. We thank all the supporters for their generosity in helping us build this place to GROW in Midtown Missoula.
